2022 October Capital Grants – Administered by the Maryland Department of General Services

The Living Farm Heritage Museum - Is utilizing their **\$200,000** grant to assist in the completion of the James Clark Main Display Building is a main component of the home to the historic documentation and artifacts of the Maryland State Dairy Shrine, representing the history and contributions of Dairy Farming from across the State of Maryland. (Howard City)

Thomas Point Shoal Lighthouse – Grant totaling **\$150,000** the project will remove nonhistorical elements of underside of lighthouse cottage, restore rotten timber cross beams, renovate wrought iron support beams concealed under non-historic elements, paint exposed structure. Encapsulate landing dock pilings to eradicate ships worms and ensure structural integrity of the pilings. (Anne Arundel County)

End Hunger Warehouse - Is utilizing their **\$128,000** grant to the project consists of a commercial grade food storage and distribution center that will meet all state and county health department guidelines. The building will be equipped with a loading dock, multiple commercial freezer/refrigerators and dry storage shelving. (Calvert County)

Hospice of Charles County - Grant totaling **\$250,000** the project will be used to improve energy efficiency and safety throughout the building and significantly add to the bereavement counseling and support programs crucial to the Charles County community. While supporting their overarching goal and mission to increase care and services to under-resourced, severely ill seniors, and their families and caregivers, in Charles County, Maryland. (Charles County)

Clinton Street Community Center – Grant totaling **\$75,000** the project will allow the organization to renovate the building so that they can help to resettle refugee families in partnership with the International Rescue Committee or Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service. (Baltimore City)

Maryland Science Center - Is utilizing their **\$2,500,000** grant to improve and restore two, separate projects at the Maryland Science Center (MSC). The first project entails modernizing the Science Center's HVAC system by replacing an air handler, upgrading the control system (thermostat), and installing a more efficient air chiller. As well as a complete redesign of the MSC's Spacelink exhibit's current space with updated educational content and new interactive exhibit components. (Baltimore City)

Historic Oakland Elevator – Grant totaling **\$300,000** the project will install an elevator into Historic Oakland is one of Howard County's oldest buildings and is host to many community events and much more. Each year Historic Oakland hosts community events for Howard County residents and the public that are not fully accessible to all attendees due to lack of an elevator to the second floor or to the basement level. (Howard County)

Freedom District ES Playground - Is utilizing their **\$25,000** grant will be to replace the school's playground equipment recently removed due to safety concerns. (Carroll County)

City of Brunswick - New Emergency Operations Center – Grant totaling **\$600,000** the project will allow construction of a 2-story, 17,200 square foot building to house City Public Works, Police Dept., and Emergency Ops Center. Public Works Vehicle Storage building with 11 open bays and 2 storage bays. (Frederick County)

MedStar St. Mary's Hospital - Is utilizing their **\$600,000** grant to be used for MSMH to renovate its Sterile Processing Department and improve its surgical sterilization capacity, for the purpose of meeting industry guidelines, improving efficiency, and improving service provision to the local St. Mary's County community. (St. Mary's County)

Ridgely Town Hall Roof Project – Grant totaling **\$87,000** the project will be used for planning/design and construction by removing existing roof, inspecting decking, installing a new metal roof, and replacing any items like damaged metal or wood as necessary. (Caroline County)

Town of Ridgely Telephone Exchange Building Roof Project - Is utilizing their **\$9,000** grant to renovate by removing existing roof, inspecting decking, installing a new metal roof, and replacing any items like damaged metal or wood as necessary. (Caroline County)

Pikesville High School Artificial Turf Field and Stadium Enhancements – Grant totaling **\$850,000** the project will allow the construction of an artificial/synthetic turf field to replace the grass field surface at Pikesville High School Recreation Center's stadium athletic field, as well as other improvements such as track renovations and the construction of a field house and other stadium area improvements. (Baltimore County)

Orchard Street Church - Is utilizing their **\$300,000** grant to be used to repair or replace Orchard Street Church's HV AC system. (Baltimore City)

Allegany County Museum – Grant totaling \$50,000 the project will be used for creating and installing a National Class Museum and central air control unit in Cumberland to meet accreditation requirements would create jobs and provide an important economic stimulus to the area. (Allegany County)

Formerly Cheverly Hospital Site - Is utilizing their **\$2,000,000** grant to the physical diligence, planning, design, demolition, and new infrastructure construction associated with the site redevelopment of the 45-acre former Prince George's County Hospital site in Cheverly, Maryland. The horizontal infrastructure design and new construction associated with the grant will allow for vertical development, totaling approximately 1.5mm SF with 1,300 new units of housing.
